Outpatient, Intensive Outpatient, and Recovery Support Services 79,365 hours of service in FY 2024-25

Clients are guided through a program that best suits their needs at each point of their recovery. Focus is on skill building, identifying denial patterns, anger management, self-discovery, relapse prevention, and building healthy relationships. Clinical services are provided by licensed/license-eligible therapists and certified/registered counselors.

Outpatient Services - Treatment for men and for women is offered for less than 9 hours per week. The program offers treatment and educational groups, treatment planning, referrals, case management, and discharge services. Outpatient services are offered in the morning, afternoon, and evening. A Spanish-speaking group is available and accessible.

Intensive Outpatient Services –Intensive outpatient services are provided for 9 to 19 hours of treatment per week, offering treatment and education groups, treatment planning, referrals, crisis intervention services, case management, and discharge services. Co-occurring specific treatment is available.

Recovery Support Services – Recovery support services include case management, peer support, housing referral, court liaison, transportation support, clinical and hospital referrals, on-site drug screening, job readiness and employment support, and assistance with insurance and government matters.

Outpatient Services, Intensive Outpatient Services, and Recovery Support Services are available at Options sites in Berkeley, Concord, Oakland, and San Leandro.

Drug Testing Services 17,512 (with 2,726 positive results) Client Drug Tests in FY 2024-25

Drug testing via urinalysis is done at our in-house, state-of-the-art laboratory in Berkeley. Clients are tested regularly, as part of their treatment program services. Samples are collected at all Options clinical sites and are securely transported to our laboratory in Berkeley for processing.

Inmate Services 107 OMCP Mentor Trainees in FY 2024-25

Options trained 107 individuals in seven California prisons in the Occupational Mentoring Certification Program. 99 passed all exams and became registered interns, and 54 were paroled/released from prison.

Recovery Residence Services 46,155 Bed-nights for 387 clients in FY 2024-25

Options operates nine sober recovery residences in Berkeley and Oakland, housing up to 140 clients per night primarily through public funding at little or no direct cost to the client. In FY2024-25, Options remodeled its two Berkeley residences with funding from the City of Berkeley Block Grant program.

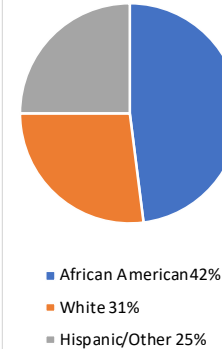
Options' Vision

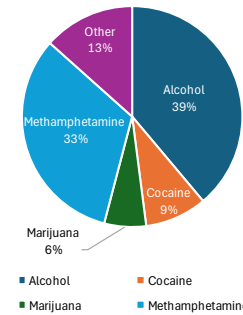
Options' Clinical Data Reports

In FY 2024-25, Options admitted 589 new adult clients in our Alameda County outpatient programs: 37% were women; 2% non-English speaking; and 95% with income below the poverty line.

Drug of Choice of New Outpatient Clients

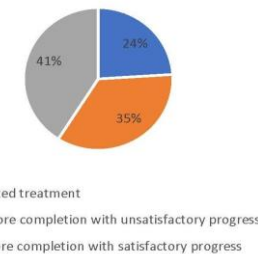


Age of New Outpatient Clients



In FY 2024-2025, 443 clients were discharged from Options' SUD treatment in Alameda County.

Discharged Clients from Options



By comparison, more than 60,000 clients are discharged from publicly funded treatment throughout California each year.

Of the clients statewide, about 50% are rated as having completed treatment or left before completion with satisfactory progress, and the remaining 50% are rated at discharge as having not made satisfactory progress.

A substantially higher percentage of Options' clients receive positive outcome ratings at discharge as compared to their cohorts throughout the state.
